

Impact Of Covid-19 On Students Studying In Australia And Their Income

Direct Impact Of Covid-19 On International Students In Australia

International students contribute about \$40 billion to the economy. International education furthermore supported about 250000, over a range of sectors. With the COVID-19 restrictions in place, about 70% of students in the higher education sector have been severely affected. The financial impact of the pandemic is also rather stark. Due to the loss of international students and issues of lesser enrolment in the international universities, academic and professional job loss of as high as 35000 has been observed.

Impact Of Covid-19 On University Education In Australia: Student's Perception

Most of the international students studying at Australian Universities have reverted to online studies. However, the impact of COVID-19 was rather negative for courses that required more practical work. For instance, for students belonging to the medical field, the experience was rather negative. As a result of it, a decline in the learner engagement ratings was observed. Students have stated that online lectures hampered their engagement with faculty. Furthermore, group discussion was also negatively influenced.

International students have also termed lack of support to be a major impeder in their performance. Due to the pandemic, the students were stuck in a foreign country. Further,



Australia provided financial support to domestic students. Further, since most of the universities were not well-versed with online education, it was especially daunting for students.



Students have also complained about the lack of online job opportunities for students. As per the common trend, most of the international students in Australia are employed in side-hustles. Due to the lack of online opportunities, the income of students has drastically reduced. The lifestyle of students has drastically been influenced.

However, despite the issues faced by the Australian education system due to the pandemic, miraculously 94% of students still gravitate towards Australian universities. The differences in culture and job opportunities are the primary concern for students.





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
