In 2017, Warid Pakistan and Mobilink merged to become Jazz, under which the business is currently operated. Aamir Ibrahim, who later went on to become the CEO of Jazz, served as the final president and chief executive officer of Mobilink, which had its headquarters in Islamabad.

Warid Pakistan is the fourth-largest GSM mobile service provider in Pakistan and the fifth-largest mobile service overall with over 12.9 million users. Its market share among mobile operators is 9%.

GSM, HSPA+, and LTE technologies were developed by mobile operator Warid. It was the sixth company to enter the Pakistani mobile phone market. The launch of the new Jazz brand was announced by the CEOs of Mobilink and Warid Pakistan on January 6, 2017. The combination of high quality audio and video is the main goal of the Warid and Mobilink collaboration. Users will be able to rapidly share their audio and video content on mobile devices because of the improved connection. Additionally, compared to other telecom companies' clients, this merger provides consumers with access to Pakistan's quickest 4G services.

Mobilink and Warid, two industry giants in the field of telecommunications, have given their customers a variety of advantages. The merging of the two businesses will allow them to increase the number of subscribers while still maintaining more than 50 million customers. The methods of doing **jazz balance check** are covered below.

How To Check Jazz Balance?

Customers who use prepaid services must open the dialing pad, enter *111#, and then press or tap the dialing button. When you call this number, a pop-up window with all the information about your remaining balance will show up in front of your mobile device's screen. The actual fee for your **jazz balance check** via the *111# code is 0.24 rupees.

Alternatively, dialing the number *444*6*2# on your dial screen and pressing the ok or call button is a second method for checking your Jazz prepaid amount.

Another option is to send a "Hi" message to the jazz WhatsApp self-service number if you have a smartphone. In this manner, you can check the information of your prepaid account balance by sending "4" to the WhatsApp number [03003008000] after sending the "Hi" message. The smartphone users can easily do the **jazz balance check** via the Jazz World App's home page.

Jazz service users without smartphones can check their prepaid balance by calling the helpline's 111 on-call numbers. The support representative will give you all the information regarding your prepaid balance in this way. However, there are some costs involved with using 111 to check your balance. Therefore, using this **jazz balance check** code to find out your balance will cost you 0.79 rupees every call.
